The New York Folklore Society, a statewide cultural organization, has embarked on a three-year project to document the impacts of Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee on the communities around the state. This project includes the recording of personal experience stories relating to flooding (both from those who were impacted and from those who volunteered during the recovery efforts); a two-year documentation project to survey archival records (documents, photographs and video, artifacts, etc.) to assess the amount of documentary evidence in partnership with the NYS Archives; and the creation of a travelling exhibit, “In Harm’s Way: Community Responses to Irene and Lee.” These projects have been funded by the New York State Council on the Arts, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the Documentary Heritage Program of the New York State Archives and Records Administration.
